



## Annual Summary 2019

### Chairs Report

This past year has been a very enjoyable year where we have really been able to run 'business as usual' after several years of development work and it's been great to have been able to reap the benefits of a full year's use of the new LED lights.

In a sport of declining participation at club level it is testament to the club, its committee and members that our membership remains static. I hear from other local clubs this is not what they are experiencing, so we must be doing something right! However, we are not complacent and we want to attract younger players and we have plans afoot to encourage that age group to participate in the game.

The competitive element of our club continues to thrive with teams competing at all ages from 4 year olds doing Mini Reds to Seniors over the age of 80. We have had some great results from teams this year, with 2 men's teams being promoted and our Women's senior A team coming second in the Senior Division 1!

Many of us have participated in the smorgasbord of tournaments held throughout the year, including the over 45's open tournament where non-members can come and try us out. It was particularly pleasing to see the success of the Delta indoor tournament back in March, after a couple of years of falling numbers and a break.

## Membership Report for 2019

Jeremy Smith (Membership)

The following table details the change in individual members by category, in what was another stable year overall for the club:

### Observations:

1. Total memberships have remained very stable after a slight drop in 2018.
2. The vast majority of payments were made online via Stripe or Go Cardless, which is by far the easiest method for the membership secretary to manage.
3. 5 payments were made by cheque, a drop from 15 last year.
4. 18 payments were made by bank transfer, a drop from 108 last year.
5. There were again a large number of late payments, which produces a lot more work for the membership secretary. The introduction of a late payment penalty is proposed from next year.



**Treasurer's report-Jonathan Vickers (treasurer)  
Financial year ending 30 September 2019**

The club's underlying financial position remains healthy. We began the year with £79,019 in the bank, and ended it with a balance of £63,129, having received a grant of £3,435 and a loan of £25,000 from the LTA, and spent £62,138 on floodlighting the back courts and installing a new toilet. This equates to an underlying cash surplus for 2018-19 of £19,039. The end-year balance includes £13,200 in a sinking fund we were obliged to create as part of our agreement with the LTA, to whom we also have an outstanding debt of £23,750.

No major new investments are planned for 2019-20. We have assumed that membership income will be roughly the same as this year plus a 2% inflation uplift.

## **AGM Juniors Report**

Firstly we would like to thank Adam, Jono and Zac for all their help and support with the juniors and for giving up their own time to help run our tournaments, we couldn't do it without you.

The 2019 winners of the Penny Alberry awards were Riley Webb for his team tennis, squad sessions and for getting picked for Gloucestershire in County Selection and Bella Boyd for her continued enthusiasm and the amazing amount of energy she brings to her tennis sessions week in and week out.

The highlight of our juniors year was the Cirencester Junior Championships held in June. We had a good number of entrants and all those who played were hugely enthusiastic, showed great team spirit and displayed some fabulous tennis.

The Road to Wimbledon is dictated by age, so fewer participants but a successful afternoon of play with our two winners, Will Pereira and Decima Archer both going on to play at Wimbledon.

Unfortunately the MIRA adult and junior tournament had to be postponed due to lack of entrants and will hopefully attract a greater number of players in November.

Once again we entered a number of teams in the LTA team tennis tournament, previously known as Aegon, but sadly again it was a less than satisfactory experience. This was due to a lack of players from many clubs, including our own. However, happily the U14 girls played brilliantly, winning the majority of matches and finished joint top of their category. Our mixed U10s also won their group, but only had to play one match to do so as their other opponents were unable to raise a team.

To date the current total junior membership is 131 which breaks down as follows: 68 juniors and 43 child memberships.



## **CTC Facilities Report 2019**

Enlightened with success after the completion of the new floodlights on the back courts and moving the fence to create the new grass area, the most important development at the club this year has been the new loo.

It was not a cheap exercise but came significantly under our £10,000 budget, most of which went on the installation of the septic tank. The design is intended to accommodate any future development of the clubhouse with the loo itself being the best we could make without spending unnecessary cash on a permanent structure. Thanks to a dedicated team of helpers who helped build, paint, lay flooring, supply chocolate croissants and vitally plumb the thing in, I hope we have created a space where everyone can celebrate their special moments and be inspired, with the help of new HOT RUNNING WATER, to keep the place clean and tidy. We have also upgraded the electrics in the clubhouse and improved the access lighting.

The next challenge on the horizon will be how to improve the track which is becoming increasingly difficult to maintain.

To everyone who *remembers to lower the nets* every time they finish playing, sweeping the clay courts and cleaning their shoes in the water.

Also to everyone on the cleaning rota for doing their bit and to the small team of regular helpers.
